

Michael D'Occhio is a reproductive biologist with a particular interest in puberty, early embryonic development, and the establishment of pregnancy in livestock. He has contributed to major reviews on the nutritional, molecular and cellular determinants of reproduction in livestock. He works closely with the livestock industry and veterinary pharmaceutical companies and was associated with commercialisation of the first contraceptive vaccine in livestock. He has co-authored more than 200 publications in high impact journals and holds positions as Honorary Professor at The University of Sydney, Australia and Emeritus Professor at the University of São Paulo, Brazil.
